Salvation Army **Kings Ripton Court**

During **June** we will be remembering Kings Ripton Court in our prayers.

The Salvation Army operates over 80 'Lifehouses' of which Kings Ripton Court is one. They are places where people can get support with their housing issues and also find support with other aspects of their lives such as employment, debt problems, training, spirituality, loneliness, addiction, or mental health.

Kings Ripton Court provides support with up to two years self-catering accommodation for 16 to 25 year old young adults. During this time residents are guided through a structured programme of personal discovery and life-skill sessions with the goal of achieving independent accommodation.

Residents are encouraged to engage in education, training, or employment and to take an active part in the decisions made within the service.

³⁵Then Jesus went about all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom and curing every disease and every sickness. ³⁶When he saw the crowds, he had compassion for them because they were harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. ³⁷Then he said to his disciples, “The harvest is plentiful, but the labourers are few; ³⁸therefore ask the Lord of the harvest to send out labourers into his harvest.”

The Twelve Apostles

¹⁰Then Jesus summoned his twelve disciples and gave them authority over unclean spirits, to cast them out, and to cure every disease and every sickness. ²These are the names of the twelve apostles: first, Simon, also known as Peter, and his brother Andrew; James son of Zebedee and his brother John; ³Philip and Bartholomew; Thomas and Matthew the tax collector; James son of Alphaeus and Thaddaeus; ⁴Simon the Cananaean and Judas Iscariot, the one who betrayed him.

⁵These twelve Jesus sent out with the following instructions: “Do not take a road leading to gentiles, and do not enter a Samaritan town, ⁶but go rather to the lost sheep of the house of Israel. ⁷As you go, proclaim the good news, ‘The kingdom of heaven has come near.’ ⁸Cure the sick; raise the dead; cleanse those with a skin disease; cast out demons. You received without payment; give without payment.
